#### Work from home, go back to the office or work in hybrid mode: Choose the best approach for you

If you only need to commute by bus within Laval, opt for an STL fare or pass. If you make no more than four round trips per week, the STL's 8-ticket bundle will cost less than a monthly pass.

If you need to use more than one mode of transportation between Laval, Montréal or the urban agglomeration of Longueuil, the 10-ticket All Modes AB bundle could be the best deal. If you make over 15 round trips per month, the TRAM Zone 3 monthly pass is likely the best option.
